## **--EX-USC OFFENSIVE TACKLE DERRELL MARSHALL DIES**

**LOS ANGELES**--Derrell "Turk" Marshall, a starting offensive tackle on USC's 1988 Rose Bowl team, died on Sunday (Jan. 17) in Upper Marlboro, Md. He was 55.

Marshall, who came to USC from Bakersfield (Calif.) Junior College, was a 7-game starter at right tackle on the 1988 Trojan squad that won its first 10 games and rose to a No. 2 national ranking.

He was selected by the Buffalo Bills in the 1989 NFL Draft.

He prepped at Howard D. Woodson High in Washington, D.C.

Marshall was given the nickname Turk because, as he once said, "When I was five, I ate a whole turkey."

After his playing days, he worked for the Prince George's County Board of Education.

He is survived by his daughter Eleia Marshall-Lartey, sons Jaelyn and Jaron, stepson David Sanders, sister DeLaunta and father Charles, as well as the mother of his children Lei G. Walker-Marshall.
